

Friends:

I wanted to give you a heads-up on an important new source of funds that will soon be available to help mitigate wildfire on non-federal lands. On January 3, 2014, the state will invite all eligible applicants to submit Notices of Interest (NOI) for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP). The NOI will be posted at [www.coemergency.com](http://www.coemergency.com) and will be **due by January 31, 2013**. This is a short turn-around so I wanted to give you as much notice as possible.

The HMGP program is funded by FEMA based on a percentage of federal flood disaster dollars that are spent in the state. The state will set-aside at least 15% of funds for wildfire mitigation projects, **and projects anywhere in the state are eligible**. The total numbers are unclear at this point, but it looks like somewhere between **\$4.5 million and \$7.5 million** will be available. The state will prioritize applications from communities who have adopted wildfire codes, and eligible projects include **defensible space, ignition-resistant construction, and hazardous fuels reduction**. Projects that are NOT eligible include those that primarily address ecological or agricultural issues, forest management, prescribed burning, clear-cutting, or projects more than two miles from a structure. Projects on federal lands are not eligible.

This is a major opportunity to help mitigate wildfire in communities across our state.
