This workshop is **FREE** and **OPEN TO THE PUBLIC!**

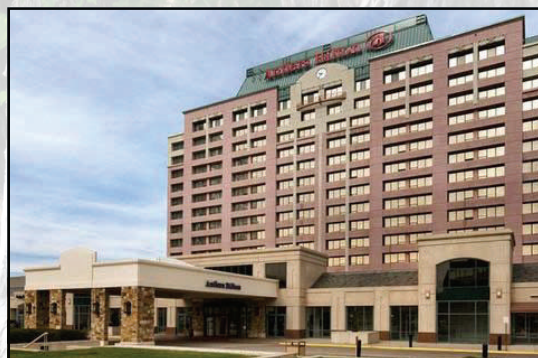
