The Colorado State Forest Service-Golden District in conjunction with the Colorado Tree Farm Association will be hosting a Mile High Tree Farm Association meeting/workshop on **Saturday April 10th, 2010 starting at 10:00 am and running until approximately 4:00 pm** at the Golden District Office of the Colorado State Forest Service located at 1504 Quaker Street, Golden CO 80401.

This workshop will focus on Colorado wood product utilization and marketing. We will have a presentation from Mike Eckhoff, a PhD candidate with Colorado State University, about the different products you can create and market from your Colorado timber. Several exhibitors will demonstrate different types of forestry and wood utilization equipment, including portable sawmills, firewood production, and biomass utilization. The Colorado Forest Products organization will also be present to discuss the current and potential wood market situation in Colorado. The tentative schedule is as follows:
