This Google Group is a forum for members of the Colorado Forestry Association and the Colorado Tree Farmers to share, discuss & debate anything related to forestry in Colorado. Membership in the group and participation is optional.

This group is restricted in order to keep discussions relevant & civil. It will not be listed in the searchable list of groups. You have to know about it in order to request to be added.

We have chosen to test this method of providing for debates and discussion over the other social media because it can be controlled by us and is considered far more private and secure than FaceBook, et.al.

How To Use Google Groups

Get a Google Account

Go to <https://accounts.google.com/Login>

If you already have a Google account you can sign in here.

If you don't have an account, click on the red "Sign Up" button (upper right).

Read the "Terms of Service" and "Privacy Policy". You have to agree to it to get an account.

Read the "Learn More" page to understand what information is required and why they want it.

This is one place where you can choose how much information to share.

Be sure to read everything on the window, especially the check boxes. You may not want the default settings.

How to Become a Group member

To ensure that our discussions remain on topic and avoid drive-by innappropriate messages, you must send your request to bruceskis@comcast.net. Include your email address in the message along with an explicit request to be added to the group. For example:

Please add me to the Colorado Forestry Topics Google Group.

My email address is yourchoiceofemailaddresses@yourdomain.xxx

Your membership in one or both of the organizations will be verified. Then you will be added to the group. You can choose the details of how you are notified of new messages by reviewing and editing your account settings..

Once Signed In

Click on the "More" tab, then "Even more" to get to Groups.
